Abstract

The Ivan Black Papers document Black's work as a publicity agent on behalf of nightclubs, musicians and entertainers in New York from the 1940s to the 1970s. They include press releases, clippings, correspondence, photographs, promotional material and published music scores.

The Ivan Black Papers were donated to the Music Division in 1983 by Jennie Black.

Biographical Note

Ivan Black (b. Philadelphia, 14 May 1903, d. New York, 25 March 1979) was a publicity agent for nightclubs, Broadway and Off-Broadway productions, musicians and visual artists in New York City from the early 1940s until his retirement in the mid-1970s.

Black grew up in Trenton, New Jersey and received a Bachelors degree in Renaissance arts and literature from Harvard in 1924. He worked as an architect in New Jersey and Florida before moving to Boston to work as a reporter for the *Boston Transcript* in 1928. After a brief return to Philadelphia, where he was an art critic for the *Philadelphia Record* and *International Studio*, and wrote for *The Theatre Guild*, he moved to New York in 1932, where he began working for the Works Progress Administration. Black formed and supervised a WPA project for unemployed writers that produced the *American Guidebook* series, among others, then was made manager of the Federal Theatre Project before being promoted to head of the Division of Information and Publicity for the Federal Theatre Radio Division. That division was dissolved in 1939, by which time Black had so many radio industry contacts that he was able to open his own publicity office.

His first clients were the Café Society (whose proprietor, Barney Josephson, was a childhood friend of Black's), the writer-director-producer Arch Oboler and *The Adventures Of The Thin Man* radio series. After the Café Society closed, Black did some work for corporate clients in the early 50s, such as the Philco Corporation, and the magazines *Argosy* and *True*, before returning to nightclub work in the late 50s with two major Greenwich Village venues, the Five Spot and the Village Gate. He continued working for both clubs into the 1960s, as well as for Basin Street East, Slug's, and, in the early 70s, Gregory's, Stryker's, Bar None and Larson's. Black occasionally worked directly for entertainers or events, including Hazel Scott, Miriam Makeba, the pianists Erroll Garner and Brooks Kerr, the singer Dardanelle and the New York Jazz Loft Celebration in 1976 and 1977. He also retained an interest in visual artists, such as Lumen Martin Winter and Jo Anne Schneider, and occasionally promoted their work.

Black publicized many important performing artists during his career. He discovered the comedian Sam Mostel at a party and launched his career at the Café Society, anointing him with the stage name "Zero" because his career had nowhere to go but up. Other major figures associated with the Café Society whom Black promoted included the musicians John Kirby, Teddy Wilson, Josh White, Edmond Hall, Albert Ammons, Pete Johnson, Benny Morton, Nellie Lutcher, Dorothy Donegan and the Golden Gate Quartet; the singer Lena Horne; and the comedians Jimmy Savo, Imogen Coca and the Revuers (Judy Holliday, Adolph Green and Betty Comden). Major jazz musicians associated with the Five Spot whom Black promoted included Thelonious Monk, Sonny Rollins, Ornette Coleman, Rahsaan Roland Kirk and Charles Mingus. The Village Gate featured jazz musicians as well, such as Miles Davis, Herbie Mann, Stan Getz and Art Blakey, but Black also promoted folk singers such as Odetta and Harry Belafonte, the South African musicians Miriam Makeba and Hugh Masekela and the comedian Dick Gregory, all of whom were featured regularly at the Gate in the 1960s.

Black did publicity for many Broadway and Off-Broadway productions, most notably *Jacques Brel Is Alive And Well And Living In Paris* at the Village Gate, but also lesser-known productions such as *Anna Lucasta*, *Devil's Galore* and *Stalag 17*. He also promoted political and social justice causes, including benefit events for John Lindsay and for the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee.

Scope and Content Note

The Ivan Black Papers primarily document the publicity work Black did on behalf of nightclubs in New York and the musicians and comedians who worked there, providing a detailed look at several key venues and the artists appearing in them from the 1940s to the 1970s. The largest portion of the collection are client and subject files containing mainly press releases and newspaper and magazine clippings, but also including promotional flyers, concert and stage programs and correspondence. The collection also contains a large section of photographs, mostly publicity headshots but also some performance and candid photos; and a set of published scores of stock musical arrangements.

Major venues documented in the client/subject files include the Café Society Uptown and Downtown, the Five Spot, the Village Gate and Gregory's. Papers for each club include performance schedules, promotional material and correspondence. Artists with significant content in the files include Zero Mostel, Hazel Scott, Thelonious Monk, Miriam Makeba, Sonny Rollins, Ornette Coleman, Erroll Garner, Jimmy Savo, Nina Simone, Brooks Kerr and Arch Oboler, among many others. The paper files also contain much documentation of Broadway and Off-Broadway stage and radio productions, including *Jacques Brel Is Alive And Well And Living In Paris*, *The Adventures Of The Thin Man*, and *Anna Lucasta*.

Black's interest in social justice and political causes is revealed by documentation of his work for the Works Progress Administration, the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee and the Congress On Racial Equality. His interest in the visual arts is documented by files for artists such as Lumen Martin Winter, Catharine Barjansky and Jo Anne Schneider, among others.

Series Descriptions

Series I: Client And Subject Files, 1927-1979 and undated **37 boxes**

This series comprises the paper portion of the collection, and consists of the files Black kept on his clients and, occasionally, on subjects of interest to him. The bulk of these papers consists of press releases, promotional literature and flyers, and newspaper and magazine clippings that were the direct results of Black's work. Some files contain correspondence with newspaper reporters and listings editors, or with nightclub owners and managers. Direct correspondence with artists is rare. Some files contain screenplays or manuscripts, sometimes with no other accompanying correspondence; these are filed by authors' names.

Sub-series 1 – Productions, 1937-1976 and undated **5.3 boxes**

Alphabetical

This sub-series contains varying levels of documentation for the Broadway and Off-Broadway shows and radio and film productions Black publicized. Most of the production files contain programs, cast and creator biographies, press releases and clippings, while others contain correspondence and other materials. The productions with the most documentation are the long-running *Jacques Brel Is Alive And Well And Living In Paris*, *Anna Lucasta* and the radio series *Adventures Of The Thin Man*. *Brel* contains extensive sets of cast and creator biographies.

Sub-series 2 – Venues, 1939-1978 and undated **3.5 boxes**

Alphabetical

Most of the papers in this sub-series consist of press releases and promotional material that promote the club or restaurant, as opposed to the specific artist being advertised. Many of the venues contain press releases or flyers with weekly or monthly overviews of who is performing and when. Venues with the most material are the Café Society, the Five Spot, Gregory's and the Village Gate.

Sub-series 3 – People And Organizations, 1927- 1979 and undated **28.2 boxes**

Alphabetical

This sub-series consists primarily of publicity material and clippings about the musicians and other performers Black was promoting for various clubs, or for his direct clients. Clients with the most content are Dardanelle, the music publisher Edward B. Marks Inc., Wilbur Evans, Erroll Garner, Brooks Kerr, Ernesto Lecuona, Miriam Makeba, Arch Oboler, the Philco Corporation, Jimmy Savo, Hazel Scott, Nina Simone, Thelonious Monk, Zero Mostel, the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, *True* magazine, and Josh White. Other clients with significant content include Miles Davis, Dick Gregory, Rahsaan Roland Kirk, Ellis Larkins, Hugh Masekela, the New York Jazz Loft Celebration, Willie "The Lion" Smith and the Works Progress Administration Federal Theatre Project, among many others, including files on Ivan Black himself that contain biographical information and datebooks. Almost all the files in this sub-series have corresponding photographs in Series II. A set of general folders at the end of the sub-series contains material not linked to any particular client, or, in the case of press releases, may discuss multiple clients.

Series II: Photographs, 1887-1978 and undated**14 boxes**

With a few exceptions, the photographs in this series were separated from folders in series I. Many subjects and clients in series I therefore have parallel sub-series and folders in this series. Most of the photographs are publicity headshots. Some folders contain performance or candid photographs, as well as contact sheets, and, in a few cases, negatives.

Sub-series 1 – Productions, 1937-1972 and undated**2.2 boxes****Alphabetical**

As in Series I, sub-series 1, the productions with the most material are *Anna Lucasta* and *Jacques Brel Is Alive And Well And Living In Paris*. Several shows documented in this sub-series have no parallel files in Series I. These are *The Deck Chair*, *Lend An Ear*, *Thunder Rock*, and *A Wave, A WAC And A Marine*.

Sub-series 2 – Venues, 1887-1975 and undated**19 folders****Alphabetical**

As in Series I, sub-series 2, the venues with the most documentation are the Café Society and the Village Gate. The Café Society folder includes many photos of musicians not found in the musicians' individual files, as well as some figures not present elsewhere in the collection. These include W.C. Handy, Bunny Berigan, Frankie Newton and Marlon Brando. The file for the Five Spot contains a photograph of Max Gordon, Joe and Iggie Termini and Art D'Lugoff, proprietors of, respectively, the Village Vanguard, the Five Spot and the Village Gate. The photos dating to 1887 are of the townhouse in which the Café Society Uptown was housed.

Sub-series 3 – People and Organizations, 1939 -1978 and undated**10.8 boxes****Alphabetical**

The subjects with the most photos in this sub-series are Miriam Makeba, Thelonious Monk, Brooks Kerr, the memorial concert for Dave Lambert at the Village Gate (featuring Duke Ellington, Tony Bennett and Stan Getz, among others), the New York Jazz Loft Festival and Hazel Scott. The photos of Thelonious Monk include rehearsals with Hall Overton at W. Eugene Smith's loft at 821 Sixth Avenue for Monk's 1963 Lincoln Center performance. Photographs promoting the 1962 Billie Holiday memorial concert feature Sonny Rollins and Rahsaan Roland Kirk playing on the steps of City Hall beside Mayor Robert Wagner. The New York Jazz Loft Festival file features photographs of participating musicians including Dave Brubeck, Jimmy Giuffre, Perry Robinson, Mark Whitecage and John Fischer.

Series III: Stock Arrangements, 1926-1945**2 boxes****Alphabetical**

The scores in this series are all published stock dance arrangements for jazz big band with violins. All contain markings indicating they were rehearsed or performed. They do not indicate which musician or band used the arrangements. Dates are taken from copyright information and may be inaccurate. The arrangements are of songs

popular in the mid-1940s, such as *Body And Soul*, *Honk Kong Blues*, *How Deep Is The Ocean* and *It Might As Well Be Spring*. More such arrangements, without markings, are in Separated Material.

Series IV: Oversized Material, 1942-1969 and undated

2 boxes

Alphabetical

Most of this series consists of oversized photographs, with divisions for people and productions. The Ornette Coleman and Larry Adler folders contain several large images, some mounted. The Coleman folder features images of the musician with each of his three instruments (alto saxophone, trumpet and violin). Among the productions, *Anna Lucasta* contains the most images. The last folder in the series, Promotional Material and Personal Papers, includes performance programs and flyers, proofs of album cover art, an honorary Doctorate in humor for Zero Mostel from City College of New York, and enlargements of newspaper clippings.
