Biographical Sketch: Cathrine Curtis was the daughter of George M. and Flora (Beach Taylor. Curtis was educated in Albany, NY and later at New York University. Curtis had a variety of careers, having at one time before 1930 owned and operated a ranch in Arizona, produced motion pictures, and appeared in the movie *Shepherd of the Hills*. During the 1930's through 1950's, Curtis served as National Director and Board Chairperson of Women's Investors in America, Inc.; National Chairperson of Women's National Committee to Keep U.S. Out of War, and President of the organization Women Investors Research Institute, Inc. At various times, Curtis lobbied for improved legal status of women with regard to property-ownership, tax obligations, business and investments. Noteworthy was Curtis appearance as a radio commentator on *Women and Money* over the American Broadcast System (ABC) during the 1930's.

Description: The bulk of the collection focuses on organizations that Curtis was involved with from the 1930's through the 1960's (mainly 1940's). The organizations represented are the Women's National Committee to Keep the U.S. Out of War (later Women's National Committee), the Women Investors Research Institute, Women Investors in America (WIIA). There are proceedings of the 1st Financial Congress of Women, held under the auspices of the WIIA. The remaining papers are personal papers of Curtis along with printed matter.

Sketches of Organizational Histories

The following are brief histories of organizations to be found in the collection:

Women's National Committee (formerly known as The Women's national Committee to keep the United States out of War).

This organization was headquartered in Washington, D.C. Cathrine Curtis served as the National Chairman. The objective of the organization was "to cooperate in the organized effort of women to keep the U.S. out of foreign wars, by means of educational, factual and protective activities so imperative, if our Republic is to be preserved.
