Biographical Note

Biographer, journalist, editor, actress, and model, Patricia Bosworth was born April 24, 1933 in Oakland, California to famed attorney Bartley C. Crum and Anna Gertrude Bosworth, a writer. She had one younger brother, Bartley Crum Jr.

Bosworth attended Miss Burke's School and Convent of the Sacred Heart in California, where she became friends with Dianne (Goldman) Feinstein. At the age of thirteen, she decided to become an actress and to use her mother's maiden name: Bosworth. In 1948, the family moved to New York City where Bosworth attended the Chapin School. She also attended École International in Geneva, Switzerland. In 1952, Bosworth eloped with an art student; the marriage lasted about a year.

She received a B.A. from Sarah Lawrence College in 1955. Bosworth worked as a model and actress, becoming a member of the Actors Studio. She appeared in a number of stage, film, and television productions, such as *Inherit the Wind* (1955), *The Nun's Story* (1959), and *Young Dr. Malone* (1958). Bosworth's final Broadway position was as an understudy to Barbara Bel Geddes in *Mary, Mary* (1961) for approximately four years.

In the mid 1960s, she left acting and became a full-time journalist. Bosworth worked as an editor at *Woman's Day* and went on to become senior editor at *McCall's* (1969 –1972), managing editor of *Harper's Bazaar* (1972 – 1974), and executive editor of *Viva* (1974 – 1976). By the late 1960s, Bosworth's byline could frequently be found in the arts section of *The New York Times* and other leading national publications. She has also been a contributing editor to *Vanity Fair*.

One day, Bosworth came home from school to find her idol, actor Montgomery Clift, lying on the living room floor of her family's upper East Side townhouse, discussing politics with her father. Bosworth's father had arranged for Clift's visit to Israel and for the actor to spend time at San Quentin to prepare for his role in *A Place in the Sun*. Bosworth's father had also been campaign manager for 1940 Republican Presidential candidate Wendell Willkie, whom Clift greatly admired. When her father introduced her to Clift, a flustered Bosworth curtsied and Clift curtsied back. Some fifteen years after that introduction, subsequent to the 1956 car accident that had destroyed Clift's handsome face, Bosworth did not recognize him when he approached her at the Actors' Studio. When their conversation ended, Clift turned and then curtsied to Bosworth.

After abandoning an attempt at a biography of Marlon Brando Clift, Bosworth chose Clift, who died in 1966 at the age of forty-five, as the subject of her first biography. Bosworth spent five years researching Clift and interviewing some two hundred and fifty people who knew him. She won the cooperation of the Clift family, especially Clift's older brother Brooks, and Clift's twin sister, Ethel Clift McGinnis. The book, *Montgomery Clift: A Biography*, was published by Harcourt Brace Jovanovich in 1978 to much critical acclaim. It became a bestseller and was published in several languages. In 1979, it was published in paperback by Bantam.

Bosworth's second biography was of photographer Diane Arbus (*Diane Arbus: A Biography*, Knopf, 1984), for whom she had modeled as a teen. Her *Marlon Brando: A Biography* (Viking Press, 2001), recounts the life of the actor who was, perhaps, the most influential of his generation.

In her book, *Anything Your Little Heart Desires: An American Family Story* (Simon & Schuster, 1997), Bosworth recounts and attempts to come to grips with the story of her powerful lawyer father, whose clients ranged from Harry Bridges, head of San Francisco's longshoremen's union, to movie star Rita Hayworth, and who served as advisor to such politicians as Harry Truman and Wendell Wilkie. Bosworth's father defended the "Hollywood Ten" and later became a victim of the blacklist himself. In 1959, five years after her brother shot himself to death, Bosworth's father also committed suicide.

In 1966, Bosworth married playwright Mel Arrighi who died in 1986. *Anything Your Little Heart Desires* is dedicated to the late actor and director Tom Palumbo, who was probably Bosworth's third husband. Bosworth is on the faculty of the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism.

Scope and Content Note

The Patricia Bosworth Papers consist of manuscripts, galleys, interview notes, research materials, clippings, correspondence, and photographs mostly relating to her 1978 critically-acclaimed and best selling biography of actor Montgomery Clift: *Montgomery Clift: A Biography* (Harcourt Brace Jovanovich, 1978), but also covering some of Bosworth's other writing projects and professional activities.

The papers contain a number of manuscript drafts of the Clift biography, although they are mostly undated and do not specify the version. There are also a number of materials surrounding its publication, such as a contract with Bosworth's original publisher, Arbor House, a few financial items, and the memo outlining the idea for the book. A number of the photographs in the collection are those used in the book.

Manuscripts, notes, and research materials may be found in the papers for a number of Bosworth's other writing projects on the arts, including many articles, mostly written during the 1970s for leading magazines and *The New York Times*. There is also a small folder of material for Bosworth's second biography, *Diane Arbus: A Biography*, published in 1984 by Knopf. A program for *Choices*, a theatrical work conceived by Bosworth, Lily Lodge, and Caymichael Patten, presented by The Women's Project in 1978 can also be found in the papers.

A few personal papers, including notes from Bosworth's mother and material from Sarah Lawrence College, are also included.

This series consists of Bosworth's papers, particularly manuscripts, but also correspondence, extensive research files, photographs, negatives, clippings, publicity material, and other items documenting her 1978 biography of the actor Montogomery Clift, published by Harcourt Brace Jovanovich, and then in paperback by Bantam in 1979.

This series is comprised of both general correspondence to and from Bosworth concerning *Montgomery Clift: A Biography* and fan mail received after the book's publication. A number of the letters are queries from Bosworth for possible interviews for the book. Correspondents include Peter Bogdanovich, Brooks Clift, Ethel (Sunny) Clift, Ethel Clift McGinnis, James Jones, Kevin McCarthy, Karl Malden, Lee Remick, Irwin Shaw, Francois Truffaut, Gore Vidal, Thornton Wilder, and Fred Zinnemann. Of particular note is a short, signed note from John Wayne.

Fan mail includes letters from Bosworth's childhood friend Dianne Feinstein, Joseph Abeles, Harold Clurman, Gael Greene, Larry Kramer, Kitty Kelley, Merle Miller, Dotson Rader, Joan Micklin Silver, Liz Smith, Jo Van Fleet, and Fred Zinnemann. Additional correspondence can be found in the General sub-series.

Sub-series 2 – Manuscripts, 1973 – ca. 1977

6.5 boxes; 2.8 linear feet

Arrangement: Chronological, then by format

This series consists of Bosworth's manuscripts and galleys for the Clift biography. All but the First and Rough Drafts are undated and most are carbons or photocopies. Also included are an Introduction and Chapter Outline, as well as some loose pages. Additional manuscript pages can be found in the Research files.

Sub-series 3 – Research Files, 1932, 1935, 1940 – 1977, and Undated

This series contains Bosworth's typed and annotated interview notes, research notes and materials, and clippings both for people who knew Montgomery Clift, as well as for productions in which he appeared. In some instances, manuscript pages are included in the files. Personalities are filed before Productions; there are also a number of subject files included at the end.

Sub-series 4 – General, 1973 – 1980 and ca. 1970s

This series is comprised of papers related to the publication of the Clift biography. Included is Bosworth's contract with Arbor House, the company originally scheduled to publish the book, corrections, publicity material, releases, and clippings. There are also manuscripts for two speeches Bosworth gave, a notebook, and some material regarding a proposed motion picture version by Sidney Lumet.

Sub-series 5 – Photographs and Negatives, 1949 – 1978

This series consists of photographs and negatives of photographs published in the book, but also includes candid photos, productions, and portraits of Clift and others not used by Bosworth. Among the portraits of Clift are two by Anthony Crickmay. Candid photos include some of Kevin McCarthy, Augusta Dabney Prince, Mira Rostova and Libby Holman. There are also a few publicity photos of other personalities, such as Bosworth.

This series contains mostly manuscripts, notes, and clippings primarily for Bosworth's profiles of performing arts notables and groups published in *The New York Times* and such magazines as *The New Yorker*, *McCall's*, *Saturday Review*, *Holiday*, and *Publishers Weekly*. Profile subjects include playwrights Robert Anderson, Charles Gordone, and Harold Pinter, director Michelangelo Antonioni, and others such as Lee J. Cobb, James Coco, Miriam Colon, Ruby Dee, Arlo Guthrie, Stacy Keach, National Theater of the Deaf, Joseph Papp, Vanessa Redgrave, Herbert Ross, Robert Ryan, Paul Sorvino, and Ellen Stewart. There are also manuscripts for articles for which no publication information can be found, as well as several subject files.

A small number of personal papers can be found at the end of this series. These include a few pieces of correspondence, several notes from Bosworth's mother, Bosworth's handwritten notes and lists, and several items from Sarah Lawrence College.
