



What is a Haiku?

The haiku is breath," or what you can utter with one breath, - Sonia Sanchez


Haikus are a traditional Japanese poetic form with three lines of five, seven and five syllables. Let's take a look at syllables. They are the beats in a word.

BLUES= 1 SYLLABLE SOME/THING. = 2 SYLLABLES PO/ET/RY = 3 SYLLABLES CAL/CU/LAT/ER = 4 SYLLABLES DIS/CRIM/IN/AT/ION= 5 SYLLABLES I.

What is a haiku? A breath of air in 3 lines. Five, seven, five: count.




